- Fall Heritage & Pickin' Party • October 10, 2009** • A festival to celebrate South Carolina Folk Heritage with artists' demonstrations, traditional handicrafts and folk art and children's activities. Enjoy toe-tappin', hand-clappin' bluegrass, "newgrass" and folk music performances, cloggers. PLUS four unique styles of South Carolina barbecue!
- Spooky Sleepover • October 23, 2009** • Enjoy a night of family Halloween fun by wearing your scariest or funniest costume and spending the night with the Museum's ghosts, ghouls and goblins! Enjoy a spooky science theater show, fiendish food, eerie entertainment and much more! Recommended for ages 5 -12 accompanied by adults. This is a chain-rattling, cauldron-bubbling event for the entire family!
- Tricks & Treats I and II • October 24 and 31, 2009** • Magicians entertain youngsters with pocket magic and incredible balloon art. Children participate in many different activities throughout the Museum such as Goblin Games, Creepy Crafts, Frightful Face Painting and Spooky Storytelling by members of the Three Rivers Storytelling Guild. Young guests also take part in a scavenger hunt that will earn them prizes and scary treasures as they "creepy-crawl" through the Museum galleries, gathering the items needed from the Museum's "Ghostly Guardians."
- Winter Fest • December 14, 2009 through January 3, 2010*** • A two-week long winter celebration featuring musical performances from area schools, carriage rides with Santa, seasonal crafts, holiday stories told by a local media personalities, and a multicultural celebration of the winter holidays. Holiday fun for children and adults! *You may choose the one-day Winter Fest event to sponsor
- "Museum Road Show" Appraisal Program • Winter Edition • January 16, 2010** • Inspired by PBS' "Antiques Roadshow," this program offers informal (verbal) appraisals of a variety of objects. Experts are available in the fields of fine art, silver, pottery, furniture, books, jewelry, textiles and dolls, as well as war artifacts ranging from the Civil War to World War II. - SC Junior Academy of Science Workshop: Geology/Paleontology • January 30, 2010** • The South Carolina Junior Academy of Science (SCJAS) is the only statewide organization of high school students designed to stimulate and promote interest among its members through the development of independent research in science and mathematics. These investigations are of a problem-solving nature and their design serves as a means for students to do exciting things in science and mathematics beyond regular classroom activities. This year's workshop theme will be geology/paleontology. SC college recruiters will be on-site encouraging SCJAS member students to pursue degrees in science at SC higher education institutions.
- Earth Day Celebration • March 27, 2010** • A day of environmental activities which include "Trash-to-Treasures" and make-and-take projects. The museum also offers water quality, air quality, and hydrogen fuel cell demonstrations and activities. And don't forget, the ever-popular, Earth Day lawn mower exchange!
- Tartan Fest: Celebration of Scottish Heritage • April 3, 2010** • A celebration of the Scottish culture with music and Highland and Scottish country dancing. The festival features a display of clans' tables, Scottish merchandise, Highland games and golf activities for children and adults.
- Congaree Art Festival • April 24, 2010** • An art festival that highlights the works of South Carolina's best artists! This show and sale of local art is offered in conjunction with Artista Vista. Museum visitors can enjoy art demonstrations and purchase pine needle baskets, paintings, pottery, mosaics and more.
- Girls in Science Day • June 4, 2010** • The South Carolina State Museum and SC ETV partner to invite middle school-aged girls (and boys, too!) to enjoy a full day of educational activities. There are hands-on science demonstrations and activities, science and technology exhibits, and a career and information fair.
- "Museum Road Show" Appraisal Program • Summer Edition • July 10, 2010** • Inspired by PBS' "Antiques Roadshow," this program offers informal (verbal) appraisals of a variety of objects.
